The aim of the ROSE project is to develop online training to provide individuals with the necessary skills to excel in remote work careers and attain economic independence.

The project is managed by Umbria Training Center, Italy with partners from Ireland, Poland and Romania and funded through Erasmus+ KA2 Strategic Partnership in the field of Vocational Education and Training for 2 years from Sept 2024 – August 2026.

During this period the the project will deliver a range of activities:

- **Diagnostic Tool:** to identify individual skills gaps
- **Online Modules and Resources:** to develop remote work skills
- **Pilot Testing:** with a target group of unemployed women
- **Website and Learning Platform:** with online modules and resources
- **Training Guidebook:** to share how to use the online learning resources

At the end of the project a series of dissemination events in each region along with a conference in Italy will share the final interactive project website and online training materials.
